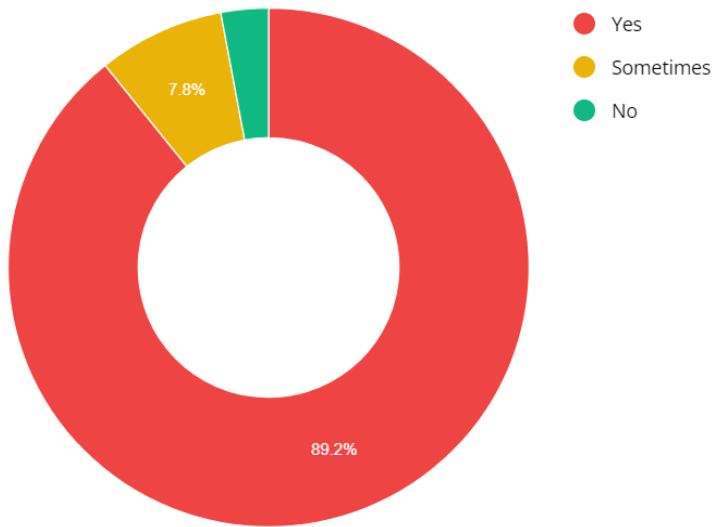
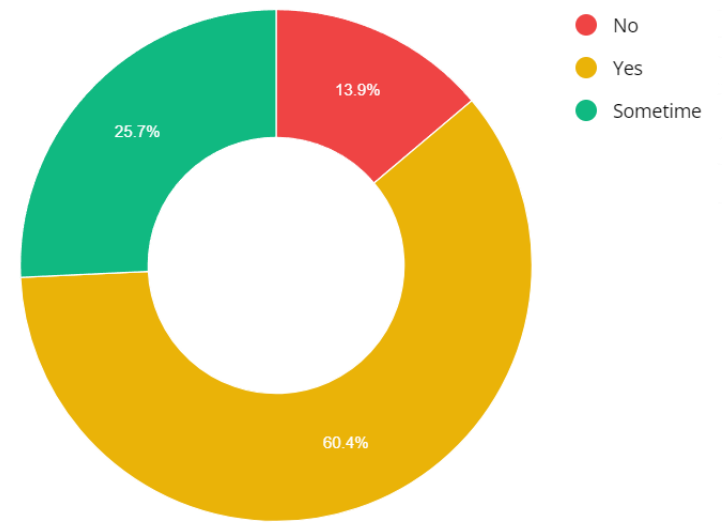

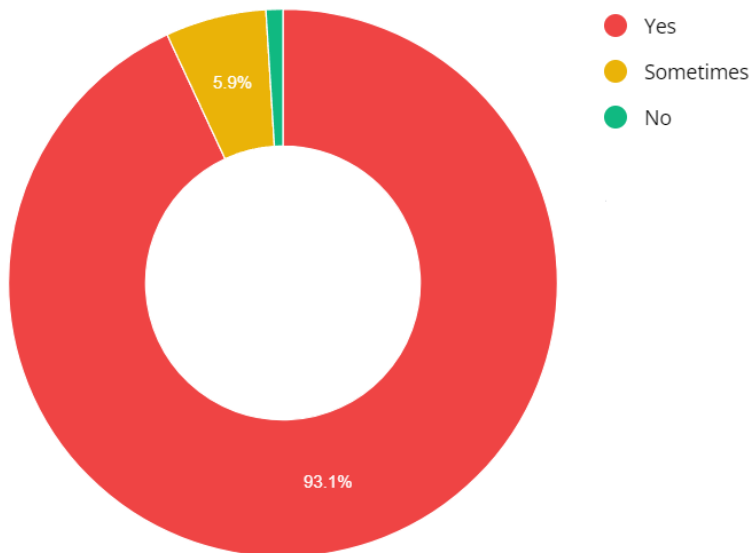
Do you read your Child's weekly class blog?



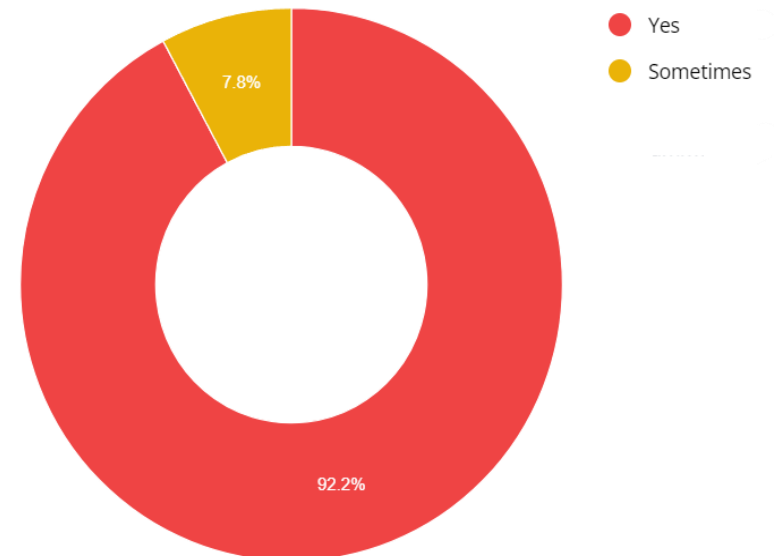
Do you use School Facebook page to keep up to date with what your child gets up to @ school?
