Focus Artist: Picasso Focus Skill: Drawing

- Explore a range of drawing tools to make marks
- Begin to show increased control of the types of marks made with a range of media.
- Draw on different surfaces
- Explore different textures
- Draw from imagination
- Draw a self-portrait, traditional and in the style of Picasso
- Explore the use of colour, pattern, texture, line and shape
- Start to explore the use of sketchbooks to record ideas and practice skills

Seasons - Collage

- Begin to use scissors and tearing to create a range of shapes
- Create an image from a variety of cut or torn media
- Arrange and glue materials to different backgrounds
- Create an Autumn collage using found materials and leaves

Kings and Queens

Focus Artist: Henry Matisse - Link to Kings and Queens

Focus Skill: Painting (Colours)

- Begin to explore and experiment with the primary colours
- Mix primary colours to create secondary colours
- Describe collections of colours
- Discuss and use warm and cold colours
- Describe favourite colours and why colours may be used for different purposes
- Explore a range of paint, brush sizes and tools
- Appraise the work of Henri Matisse (Fauvism), creating our own pieces with strong colours and fierce brushwork
- Weaving Create colourful weaving looms using bright paper
- Follow the over/under technique with the weft and warp

Focus Artist: Georges Seurat Focus Skill: Printing

- Explore pointillism and create artwork with dots
- Use objects to create prints (e.g., fruit, vegetables, or sponges)
- Begin to press, roll, rub and stamp to make prints
- Take rubbings from textured surfaces: e.g leaf, coin, tree bark
- Begin to identify different forms of printing e.g books, newspapers, fabric, wallpaper
- Know that printmaking is making art by printing pictures, normally on paper
- Create a pointillism inspired print piece using small circular objects (cotton buds, pencils, etc.)

Focus Artist: Jo Gough (Chester) Focus Skill: Digital Art

- Use iPads independently to create pictures
- Use simple tools e.g., brush and pen tools
- Experiment with filters and effects
- Edit work on an iPad
- Sketch animals using drawing apps (Freeform and Noteability)

Focus Artist: Van Gogh Focus Skill: Painting / Collage

- Begin to describe a range of colours independently
- Mix a range of secondary and tertiary colours
- Be able to discuss the colour wheel
- Talk about why they have selected colours for their artwork
- Begin use a range of paint and discuss why some are more suited to particular painting styles
- Create a Great Fire of London painting in the style of Van Gogh's Starry Night
- Discuss Post-Impressionism and look at other examples
- Experiment with a range of collage techniques such as tearing, overlapping and layering to create images and represent textures
- Use sketchbooks to design collage creations
- Collect, sort and arrange materials according to colour or texture
- Create a skyline of London to form a GFOL collage in the style of Van Gogh (Starry night)
- Remembrance Day Poppy fields collage pictures

Focus Artists: Da Vinci, Paul Klee (comparison) Focus Skill: Drawing

- Show increased control over pencil skills with more attention to detail in faces and bodies
- Draw lines of different sizes and thicknesses, with a variety of media (e.g., charcoal, pencil, and pastels)
- Sketch to make records
- Investigate tone by drawing light/dark lines using pencil
- Investigate textures and produce an expanding range of patterns
- Self-portrait in the style of Paul Klee
- Compare Klee and Da Vinci Mona Lisa (Links with history work) - introduction to the Renaissance period

Focus Artist: David Hockney Focus Skill: Sculpture / 3D

- To understand that sculptures can be made from anything
- Use Lego, Magnatiles, sugar cubes, blocks and art straws to create buildings
- To have experiences creating sculptures using man-made materials from imagination and direct observation
- Explore the use of different techniques to make paper appear 3D
- Replicate patterns and textures in 3D form
- Draw our school in 3D form

- Create accurate observational drawings
- Work on a variety of scales
- Consider scale and proportion
- Understand how to draw different parts of the face with more detail (Hope hands portrait)
- Use shading to add texture to the drawing and to show light and shadow (hatching and cross hatching)
- Adapt and refine ideas as they progress, annotating sketchbooks with explanations of ideas
- Draw for a sustained period of time
- Collect and record visual information
- Develop techniques to create intricate patterns (Zentangle)
- Compare the work of different illustrators
- Create some of my own illustrations, inspired by research

Year 1 and 2 – Self Portraits

- Discuss the work of other sculptors and architects and how these have influenced their own work / designs
- Work with a group to decide the best way to join and secure materials together
- Think more about the aesthetics of a piece
- Work in a safe, organised way, caring for equipment
- Secure work to continue later
- Adapt work when necessary and explain why
- Demonstrate awareness in environmental sculpture
- Create an animal sculpture inspired by Michelle Reader (using recycled objects)

Focus Skill: Collage

- Animal based collage
- Research key features of collage
- Use mixed media to add differences to collage
- Accurately make repeated patterns
- Cut with increasing accuracy
- Combine pattern, colour and shape to show detail in my animal collage
- Use sketchbooks to design animal collages based on Michelle Reader
- Carefully choose colours to make the artwork 'pop' (contrasting background and foreground)
- Use ripping or cutting to select pieces to make the right shape for the animal
- Understand different glues and how they can be used to stick materials together

Easter Egg Competition

- Make tints, tones and shades using white, grey and black
- Observe colour and suggest why it has been used
- Independently choose the right paint and / or equipment for the task.
- Select colour to reflect mood
- Explore different brush strokes and why / when they might be used
- Begin to discuss how they are influenced by the work of other artists
- Be able to mix colours with accuracy to match objects
- Learn about Monet and Impressionism compare with post-Impressionism
- Use a number of brush techniques using thick and thin brushes to produce shapes, textures, patterns and lines



6 Focus Artist: Henry Moore Focus Skills: Sculpture

- Research Henry Moore and how his sculptures relate to WW2
- Develop and imaginatively extend ideas from starting points
- Annotate sketches to explain and elaborate ideas with confidence
- Recognise sculptural forms in the environment and use these as inspiration for their own work
- Create original sculptures using clay and wire following the chosen medium's required method
- Research abstract and semi-abstract pieces like Moore's and discuss their symbolism and meaning
- Shape, form, model and join with confidence.
- Compare ideas, methods and approaches to their own and others' work and say what they think and feel about it
- Adapt work according to their views and describe how they might develop it further

Focus Artist: Jill Pelto COP∞ Focus Skill: Collage



- Work with a partner to research and represent chosen climate change data in the form of a collage
- Use collage as a means of extending work from initial ideas
- Independently select a range of media to produce a collaged image (climate change representation)

Focus Skill: Drawing
Focus Artist: Stephen Wiltshire

- Select appropriate media and techniques to achieve a specific outcome
- Develop their own style
- Draw for a sustained period of time over a number of sessions
- Create a cityscape with attention to detail
- Use tone in drawings to achieve depth
- Develop drawing with perspective and focal points
- Adapt drawings according to evaluations and discuss further developments

Focus Artist: Takashi Murakami Focus Skill: Painting – Colour

- Select colour to express feelings
- Discuss harmonious and contrasting colours and their placement on the colour wheel
- Work in a sustained and independent way, developing own style
- Purposefully control the types of marks, brushstrokes used to create desired effect
- Use colours and brushstrokes to create atmosphere and light effects
- Create a Murakami inspired piece, focussing on colour choice

Focus Artist: Child-led research
Focus Skill: Mixed Media - Carnival Masks

- Children will independently research and create their own Carnival masks, choosing from a wide variety of materials
- They will use their knowledge of collage, painting and drawing to design and then create their mask
